



School Sports Premium Grant Expenditure 2024/25

How we will spend the School Sports Premium and who will benefit?

Starting in September 2013, each school will be receiving additional funding through the Sports Pupil Premium to promote sport following London 2012.

Carry forward: £ 12 049

Total grant available: £28 729

We intend to:

1. *Maintain and extend our involvement in competitive sport within school and with other local schools.*
2. *Maintain our extra-curricular sports opportunities for all children.*
3. *Employ high quality sports coaches for some sessions of PE.*
4. *Improve skills in cookery to encompass a healthy balanced diet.*
5. *Improve the number of children achieving the 25m standards in swimming.*
