School Development Update

We are making good progress towards our priorities this year:

Improvement priority 24-25	Progress against priorities
To further develop pupils' use and understanding of year group specific mathematical vocabulary to allow for better outcomes in reasoning and problem-solving questions. (key driver 2)	All staff have completed additional training on using the new Moths pathway we have adopted. All classrooms have the appropriate and relevant vocabulary displayed in the classroom and it is being used through the school. We have been selected to work with the maths hub, which we are really excited about as this will help develop our teaching and the children's learning even further. This will begin shortly.
To reduce persistent absenteeism to be in line or lower than National average – target of 10% (key driver 5)	We have now appointed a Family Liaison support worker who will be focusing on improving attendance, particularly for those who are persistently late to school. School is still robustly monitoring all children's attendance.
To further improve children's retention of knowledge over time in foundation subjects.	We have developed and are using different ways for the children to demonstrate their retention of knowledge in the variety of subjects they learn. The children are growing in confidence with explaining what they have retained.

Attendance at school -Term 2 attendance overall= 93.6%



Again, a reminder that the school day starts at 8.45am and any child arriving after 8.50am when the side gate is locked will be marked as late. In Term 2 we still had too many children arriving at school late. All our lessons begin promptly at 8.50am and so those that are arriving after that are missing vital learning.

PE and swimming



Pupil Premium and Free School Meals



It is important that everyone who is in receipt of any State benefits makes an application for Free School Meals, even if their child already receives a free meal as they are an Infant child.

Apply using Lincolnshire's Parent Portal.

The system is the one used to identify to the Department for Education children who may be in need of additional educational support.

School receives additional funding from the Pupil Premium Fund in the school budget which means we can ensure all children fulfil their potential.

As a school we are also able to support the families of children who qualify for Free School Meals benefit by provision of free uniform items, reduced contributions to trips and free-swimming transport, etc.



Sickness/diarrhoea

If your child does have a bout of either (or both!) please ensure that he/she is kept at home until 48 hours after the last occurrence. We appreciate that this can be very inconvenient, if you are a working parent, but it is essential to ensure we reduce the spread of infections.

Head lice

We will probably never be free of these little irritating creatures, but if everyone checks the heads of **all** family members regularly and treats with a commercial product or by regular combing through with a lice comb, we can try our best to be head lice free.

We will continue our practice of contacting the parents of any child who is seen by staff to have head lice to ask that the child be collected from school and treated. Please don't be embarrassed if you get the phone call – head lice are a problem everyone has had to deal with at some time or another.

Absence from school

If your child is unwell and must be absent, please telephone us as early as possible. You may leave a message on the answering machine, send an email or report via ParentMail. Under safeguarding we have a duty to call you to find out why your child is not in school if we have received no indication from you regarding the absence.
